

Until recently, Zika?once considered a mild disease?was hardly a cause for global panic. But as early as August 2015, doctors in northeast Brazil began to notice a trend: many mothers who had recently experienced symptoms of the Zika virus were giving birth to babies with microcephaly, a serious disorder characterized by unusually small heads and brain damage.

By early 2016, Zika was making headlines as evidence mounted?and eventually confirmed?that microcephaly is caused by the virus, which can be contracted through mosquito bites or sexually transmitted.

The first death on American soil, in February 2016, was confirmed in Puerto Rico in April. The first case of microcephaly in Puerto Rico was confirmed on May 13, 2016. The virus has been known to be transmitted by the Aedes aegypti or Yellow Fever mosquito, but now Aedes albopictus, the Asian Tiger mosquito, has been found to carry it as well, which means it might affect regions as far north as New England and the Great Lakes. Right now, at least 298 million people in the Americas live in areas "conducive to Zika transmission," according to a recent study. Over the next year, more than 5 million babies will be born.

This is a decent historical and popular-science account of the Zika virus intended for a general audience. McNeil is a deft and effective science journalist, and keeps the book interesting and informative. I enjoyed his account of tracking down a small group of scientists who had come down with Zika virus (prior to the outbreak), proving that human-to-human exposure existed. The accounts of microcephaly were jarring, but illustrated the author's points about prevention. One qualm I had was that at times, he seemed to deemphasize the severity of Guillain Barre syndrome, an autoimmune-mediated reaction against nerve cells causing severe weakness. Though it is true that patients can make a full recovery, a subset of patients are left with disability and in the acute phase, patients are at risk for respiratory compromise and cardiac arrhythmias. Additionally, the subtype of neuropathy (acute motor axonal neuropathy) most associated with Zika virus tends to cause a more severe motor weakness than the typical Guillain Barre triggered by other inciting infections and have a more prolonged recovery.

This is a good book for a general audience, and the Q/A section at the end is accessible for most readers. If you are looking for a more precise account of Zika's effects on the developing brain, JAMA Pediatrics (11/3/16 issue) published a very thorough literature review on the defects associated with congenital Zika. As a neurologist-in-training I found this book to be a bit simplistic, but a good starting point for starting a dialogue with patients asking questions about Zika. While he does make some controversial recommendations re- pregnancy and planning, most of his suggestions (using mosquito repellant, avoiding endemic areas in the summer if possible, covering skin as much as possible when in high-risk areas) are good common practice.
